Sodium carbonate

Male rats were exposed to an aerosol of 2% aqueous solution of this chemical, 4 hr.day, 5 days/week for 3-1/2 months. No effect was observed at a concentration of 10 or 20 mg/cubic meter. At 70 mg/cubic meter weight gain was decreased and the lungs showed thickening of the intra-alveolar walls, hyperemia, and lymphoid infiltration., Repeated or prolonged skin contact with this product may cause dermatitis and blistering.

Boric acid

This chemical has been evaluated in several laboratory animal species and in only one species was found to cause fetotoxicity at maternally toxic doses.

Sodium carbonate

This chemical has been tested in laboratory animals and no evidence of teratogenicity was seen.

Boric acid

This product has been shown to be non-mutagenic based on a battery of assays.

Sodium carbonate

This product was determined to be non-mutagenic in the Ames assay. It was also shown to be non-clastogenic in the chromosomal aberration test.

Boric acid

This material did not cause cancer in long-term animal studies.
